
The theme this year is 'Putting Carers on the Map' which is all about highlighting the invaluable contributions of carers across the UK and ensuring their voices are heard loud and clear.

We are very excited to announce the launch of our Family, Friends & Carers Training for Forensic Staffjust in time for Carers Week!







The training will cover 10 key area's of focus which have been highlighted through the 12-month pilot.

We aim to learn at scale, sharing knowledge and expertise across West Yorkshire services, with multiple learning options, including face to face networking opportunities, virtual and train the trainer.

The training will be rolled out across West Yorkshire, initially being offered to key carer leads and champions. Julianne will be in touch with you very shortly to offer dates to attend.

What else are we up to?

The Family, Friends and Carer standards for 2024 will be revised and refreshed in collaboration with Carers.

We hope to incorporate the current variety of standards and guidance for involving carers in secure hospitals, into one go-to set of standards.

What about our staff carers?

Did you know that new rights for unpaid carers in the UK came into force from 6 April 2024?

Millions of people in the UK juggle their unpaid caring responsibilities with paid employment. Balancing work and care can be a real struggle – with many carers saying they are tired, stressed and struggling to manage their own physical and mental health.

After many years of campaigning, the Carer's Leave Act was successfully passed by parliament.



This means that all carers in employment now have a statutory right to take five days of unpaid leave from work each year to fulfil their caring responsibilities.
